ICAS at Edendale

Our own Edendale medal winner

Last Saturday, Miller Bingley received an ICAS medal in Digital Technologies at a special ceremony which was held at the University of Auckland. Miller was one of two who achieved the highest score at the Year 4 level across New Zealand and other countries. His success and award demonstrates his achievement is of a world standard. Congratulations Miller! May this be one of your most memorable moments for 2017.

This means he was at the top of his year level ahead of thousands of other students who sat this test. The medal was re-presented to him at school in front of his peers on Tuesday because of the significance of this achievement.

Similar ceremonies are held in the other countries where ICAS is sat. Around 1.5 million ICAS tests are sat in over 20 countries. The University of New South Wales conducts these ICAS tests. There are new

tests each year in the 6 subject areas and are designed to develop higher order thinking and problem-solving skills.

Our results

This year the school has had some great ICAS results among our Year 3-6 students. Here is the summary of our student achievement.

Year 3 students can only sit Spelling, Science, English and Mathematics. Years 4-6 can sit all ICAS tests. There were some very positive results with an increased number of students achieving distinction and high distinction.

Thank you to all parents who have given the opportunity for their children to sit one or more of the ICAS tests this year.

We are so pleased with the effort being made by students doing Mathletics and achieving so many certificates.

You must earn five Bronze certificates to qualify for a Silver certificate and four Silver certificates to qualify for a Gold certificate. An impressive achievement!
