Dear Parents and Caregivers,

We are coming to the end of an eventful term full of learning and fun. I hope you and your families are safe and well after the storm on Tuesday night. The Edendale buildings were not damaged, but the historic oak tree on the bottom field fell over. We are so sad to lose such a beautiful tree which has a lot of significance to the Edendale community. We will holding a blessing for the tree at 1:00pm Saturday 14 April on the school field. Families are welcome to join us for this. More information will be sent home tomorrow. The children and teachers are currently thinking of ways that we could commemorate and celebrate the tree. No decisions have been made yet and we are getting advice from Auckland Council. At this stage our first priority is safety, so the bottom field is closed until further notice. A big thank you to Matt Darby-Smith, an Edendale parent, who kindly volunteered his time yesterday to help clean up the fallen debris around the school. Your help was much appreciated Matt.
