Kia ora, kia orana, namaste, talofa lava, malo e lelei, ni hao ma, fakaalofa lahi atu, asalam alikum, bonjour, greetings, hello everyone

Dear Parents, Caregivers and Whānau,

Welcome to the end of the second week of Term Three and my second week at Edendale where everyday I am feeling more and more at home. The tamariki have been wonderful with their continued support around helping me with learning their names and being so patient when I can't quite remember. It has also been a pleasure meeting and greeting so many of you at the school road crossings over the last two weeks.

This weeks newsletter brings you news of the impending teacher strike on <u>Wednesday 15 August</u> (the week after next). At this stage, I would ask parents/caregivers/whānau to make arrangements for children to be cared for at home as it is possible that the **school will be closed** on **Wednesday 15 August**. This is a decision the Board of Trustees (BoT) will be making at their BoT meeting early next week and the BoT will then advise you all after next Tuesday.

As I have only been here for two weeks it is hard for me to gauge the support in our community for such action but I hope like where I have come from that you can understand that this was a hard decision for teachers to make but needed to be made so that school and all the parts that makeup Edendale (and every other school across the motu) can be supported so we can provide the very best teachers for your children, the very best support staff, and the very best resourcing.

Why are teachers striking? Both primary teachers and principals are determined to send a strong message to the Government and demand change so our students can have a teacher in every classroom, the learning support they need and teachers are recognised as the professionals they are. Teachers and principals appreciate the inconvenience of strike action on some families. Members do not take the decision lightly. Primary teachers have not taken industrial action in New Zealand since 1994 and the fact that we are taking such a step now shows the grave concerns we have for the future of quality public education. The government needs to take courageous steps now!

What are we asking for?

Fixing the teacher shortage crisis

Schools are struggling to attract and retain great teachers. There is also a drop in the number of people choosing to train as teachers. This is happening because of years of political undervaluing of the profession. It won't just fix itself

What we want

 Significant pay increases for teachers and principals over the course of the agreement.

Time to teach, time to lead

Teachers and principals are facing immense pressure thanks to enormous workloads and more responsibilities without any additional staffing or time.

There aren't enough resources available for supporting children with additional learning needs.

Teachers and principals need time to teach, and time to lead.

What we want

 Significant increases to staffing available to all schools to support leaders, classroom teachers and teachers working with students with additional learning needs.

Fixing issues with relativities and career development

Options for career development can vary a lot from school to school, which means that teachers aren't getting the same chances to grow in the profession

At the moment, there are some issues with relativity, and there is limited recognition for teachers and principals with specialist skills.

Both these factors are contributing to the teacher shortage crisis.

What needs to change

- Fix existing pay arrangements for principals
- Fix existing relativity issues
- Create meaningful new career options for teachers and principals

The Board of Trustees has been informed of a possible teachers' strike on Wednesday 15 August. The vast majority of our staff are members of the NZEI (Union).

The Board would encourage parents to make alternative arrangements for the supervision of their children on this day as the school may have to close.

Payment by direct credit to our account is preferred (the account number will be on the form). One payment per child and please always add reference details - child name and room number to help us match the payment to the order.


