Kia ora, kia orana, namaste, talofa lava, malo e lelei, ni hao ma, fakaalofa lahi atu, asalam alikum, bonjour, greetings, hello everyone

Dear Parents, Caregivers and Whānau,

We are nearly halfway through this term. There has been a lot happening! Here is an update on some changes that are taking place.

We welcome Sheikha Shoaib to Aroha Team and also our new tamariki: Muhammad, Muhammad, Cooper, Luke, Guy and Mika who have started at Edendale in the last couple of weeks. Today the students in Room 25 moved to Room 30. After this move, Aine Connaughton is returning to Ireland and will be away from Wednesday 29 August and will return on Wednesday 12 September. Sue Saxon who is an experienced Junior teacher will be her reliever for most days that Aine is away. Sheikha will establish a class in Room 25 from existing students across the Aroha Team. This will mean that the overall class sizes will be reduced and more manageable for the Y0-1 teachers. We acknowledge the parent concerns raised regarding the class sizes and we have been focused on addressing them. With the current Y0-1 pre-enrolments numbers, we will also be welcoming Michelle Burgess (Mondays - Wednesdays) and Vivienne Gardiner (Thursdays to Fridays) to start our next new entrant class in Room 31 at the beginning of Term 4. Thank you to those parents who have completed pre-enrolment forms. However if your child/ren is due to start in Term 4 or early in 2019, please can you complete your pre-enrolments at the office soon. This will help with forward planning and allow time for staffing matters to be sorted.

Gillian Appleby will be leaving us on Friday 17 August and we wish her all the best. Bronwyn Ward will be the teacher for Room 6 until the end of the year. She has experience teaching Y5-6 students as well as taking over a class part way through a school year.

Petra McDermott will be leaving us on Friday 28 September (last day of Term 3) and we wish her well in her new job, closer to home. Sue Saxon will be the teacher for Room 23 from the start of Term 4 until the end of the year.

As you will be aware the teachers went on strike yesterday to highlight a number of issues, one being the shortage of class teachers. This increasing shortage affects the number and availability of relief teachers to cover classes when teachers need to be away. As a consequence and last option, classes may need to be split from time to time to ensure that students are supervised, and planned events can take place.

Here are some student highlights and activities that have taken place in the last two weeks. Congratulations to our Netball teams who represented us in the Eden Albert Tournament last Thursday. The teachers were very proud of the student's efforts. Thank you to Nikita Tapora, Byron Stephenson, Emma Henry and Annette Herbert for running practices and organising the trip. Thank you to all the parents and families who supported the players.

Some of our Y5-6 students performed at The Kids Sing event at the Town Hall on Tuesday. This is the first time our students have taken part in this event. They were fabulous and the choral singing was outstanding! Thank you to Vanessa Felix and Liz Osokin for training the students and organising the trip. It is an occasion that the students are likely to remember for a long time

Our Young Leaders group are encouraging students to bring canned food to school which will be donated to the Salvation Army. Last year the final number of cans donated was 1,055. They hope to exceed this total. Thank you to those students and families who have already brought in cans for this worthy cause. Please keep the canned food rolling in. Thank you to Annette Herbert for supporting the students in this group.

A few parents have asked about the availability of language classes at Edendale. Currently there are two lunchtime language programmes running. These are run weekly. Due to the high interest, the teachers have had to put a limit on the number of students that can participate. For this term, Fabienne Gillies is running a French class for some students from Rapu team and Ingrid Cheung (with some parent support) has started a Mandarin class for some Ako and Rapu students. Alongside these language classes, there are a range of other weekly lunchtime activities available for students. It is wonderful to see the student participation and enthusiasm in these staff-led activities.
