Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori - 2018

This week is Maori Language Week. Hundreds of people now celebrate September as Mahuru Māori, in which they dedicate themselves to speaking Māori. This year's theme has been '**Kia Kaha te Reo Māori**'. 'Kia Kaha' is well known in New Zealand with its correct Māori meaning of 'be strong'. We often talk about lan-guages as if they are people – talking about language health, strength and revitalisation. So when we say 'Kia Kaha te Reo Māori' we're saying - 'Let's make the Māori language strong'. Stu-dents have been learning Te Reo, participating in games, activities and waiata within classes around the school during this special week.
