ICAS exams in 2019

From 2019 onward the name of the exams students opt into and pay for will be called Reach. They are similar to the ICAS exams, however, the top 3% of the hardest questions will be taken out of each exam. There will still be a cost related to each of these exams. Only students that achieve a **distinction** or **high-distinction** in the **Reach** exams will be eligible to pay for and sit the ICAS exams. These whānau will be contacted by school and offered this next level exam (at their cost and additional to the Reach exam payment). The ICAS exams will consist of the 3% hardest questions taken out of the Reach exams (among others) and sitting will be optional.

There will be a parent information evening at the beginning of 2019 - Please feel free to come along to this evening with any questions you may have. A date and time is still to be confirmed.


