Our Learning

Looking back at the end of term two, we saw students become the teachers as they shared new words related to the ocean through their 'Adopt a Word' oral language presentation. Students chose a word related to our 'Under the Sea' inquiry and created a diorama at home to share with their peers. Other highlights for us in term two included Matariki celebrations, gymnastics and our trip to Kelly Tarltons.

Akoranga will continue this term exploring our learning through water as we inquire into water conservation.

Students this term will be looking at how we use water in our homes and at school. We will also be researching how other people around the world access drinking water as well as identifying ways we can conserve this valuable resource. If you have any expertise in this area we would love to hear from you.

We are also excited to be looking forward to Garden to Table.

Room 2 will be beginning in Week 5 and Rooms 3, 4 and 5 will have their turn at the beginning of Term 4. Parent involvement is an essential part to the success of this programme so if you are able to volunteer to help (even for one day) it would be greatly appreciated.
