Travelwise: Walking School Bus

The Edendale Walking School Buses (WSBs) are an organised way for Edendale Primary School children to enjoy walking to school. The programme is supported by Auckland Transport but owned and operated by adult volunteers. Children join the WSB at designated stops and adult "conductors" supervise the walk. Adults of children that use the WSB usually walk as a conductor at least once a week.

Below is an outline of the two existing WSB routes. Please feel free to contact the coordinators of the existing WSB routes, Elizabeth and Karen, if you have any questions or would like to enquire about starting up a new route.

Route 1 - Lambeth Road

- 1. Lambeth Rd WSB Bus stop 1 39 Lambeth Rd. 8am
- 2. Bus stop 2 -Meets and departs from the corner of Wembley Rd/Highcliff Rd 8.05am
- 3. Bus stop 3- corner of Arabi and Halesowen Rd. 8.15am
- 4. Cross over into Arabi St. Pass Oxton Rd, Mars Ave and then turn left into Jason Ave.
- 5. Finally turn left into Sandringham Rd and cross at 419 Sandringham Rd (patrolled school crossing)
